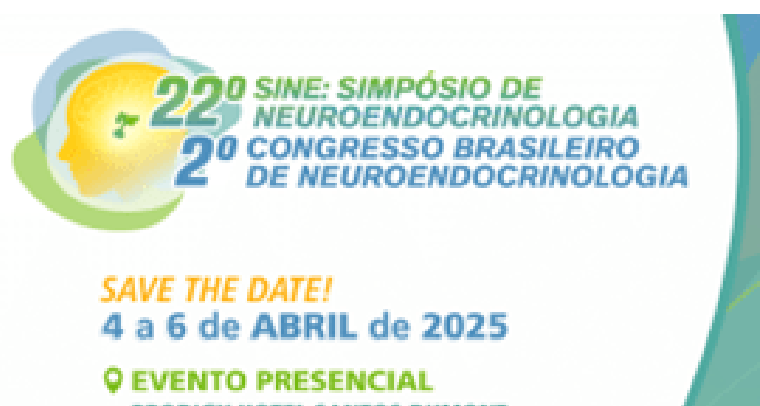
**Conference on hypercortisolism

**22nd International Symposium on Neuroendocrinology (SINE)
Rio de Janeiro, Brasil (April 4-6, 2025)**



In April, we celebrated the great success of the 22nd International Symposium on Neuroendocrinology (SINE) held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil— a vibrant gathering of researchers and clinicians and the largest neuroendocrinology event in South America, with more than 250 participants, that was highlighted by lectures from Professors **Andrea Isidori** and **Niki Karavitaki**, whose presence was made possible through the strong and fruitful partnership between ENEA and SBEM.



In 16th and 17th June, it took place with great success the 19th WorldMEN 2025 endorsed by ENEA. The first Multiple Endocrine Neoplasia (MEN) Meeting took place in Canada in 1984, including the world's leading experts on MEN, in research to discover the genes involved in MEN syndromes. Indeed, this effort led to the discovery, a few years later, of the RET and MEN1 genes. In 2025, the meeting took place in São Paulo, Brazil with a number of great lectures of specialists in pituitary, adrenal, parathyroid, pancreas and thyroid tumors along with lectures of our ExCo members Professors **Albert Beckers**, **Marta Korbonits**, **Luciana Naves** and **Krystallenia Alexandraki**.



It is an honour of us that our members have been awarded all over the world. On June Professor **Luciana Naves** received a prize for relevant women in healthcare in Brazil and on 30th June was honored by the Brazilian Society of Endocrinology and Metabolism (SBEM) at the Brazilian Congress Endo Recife for her significant contribution to the field of Endocrinology.





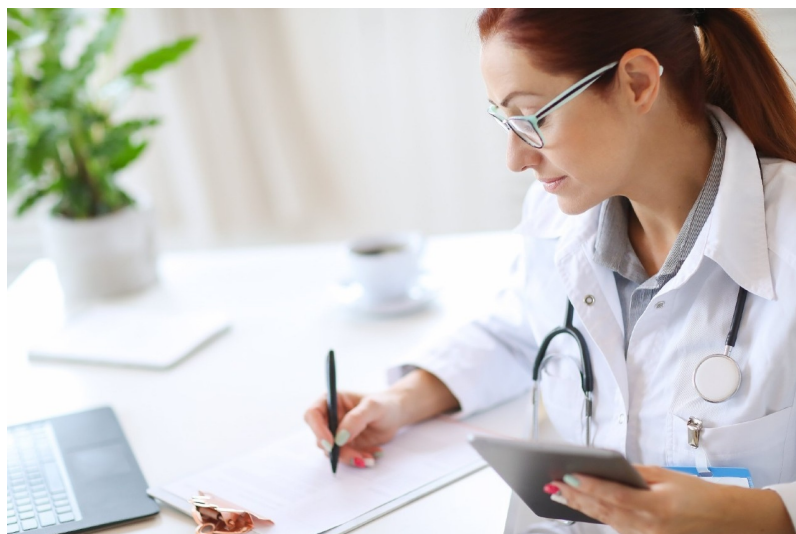
